

Leaders-In-Training (LIT) Adventure Series

Waypoint Adventure's Leaders In Training (LIT) series is an adventure-learning, leadership development program for young adults with disabilities between the ages of 16-28. The LIT program was designed to use the transformational power of adventure to teach participants skills that they can apply to their everyday life, all within a supportive community of peers and mentors.

Focused on transition-aged-youth, this program is designed to develop leadership skills, improve self-determination and increase self-confidence. This this 7-month commitment of one adventure per month is for a cohort of around 8-10 participants. At Waypoint, we believe that at the intersection of challenge and support, people learn and grow. Through challenges like rock climbing, kayaking, hiking, and the overnight backpacking trip, LIT programs instill confidence and a sense of belonging. LITs learn practical adventure skills as well as important life and leadership lessons, equipping them for the pursuit of future goals.

Upon graduation, participants of the LIT program will join a growing community of young adults who continue to adventure and socialize together outside of Waypoint programs. They are also invited to offer their leadership skills to the Waypoint community in various capacities. For example:

- blog about events
- help recruit participants for future programs
- volunteer on a program (for those who meet our volunteer eligibility requirements) and do things like help paddle a tandem kayak or belay a participant rock climbing
- help plan LIT alumni gatherings and events
- mentor a future LIT participant

Above all, LITs benefit from the bonds and friendships formed throughout the months of shared experience and adventure!

Candidate requirements to apply for the LIT program are:

- Have a formal interview with a Waypoint staff member
- Be reasonably familiar and comfortable with social settings
- Can participate in group discussions around a theme or goal
- Can answer open ended questions
- Can generally follow multi-step instructions or stick to a task independently (or with few prompts)
- Commit to attending and participating in all LIT programs (some exceptions allowed)



TIME & COST

The LIT Adventure Series runs from May to November. During this series, LITs will participate in seven programs, which include an overnight weekend in September. The series concludes with a Graduation/Reception in November of which alumni are invited.

Transportation from the Waypoint office in Lexington is provided. We will meet at the office at the start time listed below, and be back at the Waypoint office for pick up at the ending time.

The LIT Adventure Series costs \$960. This fee covers all programs and provides each LIT with a Waypoint LIT T-shirt and 20% off all of Waypoint Adventure's Open Enrollment programs for up to a year. *Scholarships available upon request.*
